OBJECTIVE:

A responsible and challenging position that will utilize my education, training, and experience, expand my knowledge and offer personal and professional growth.

BACKGROUND:

Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), Sept, 1983 to April 2005

Compliance Assistance Specialist (CAS) Jan, 2000 to April, 2005. In this non enforcement position I had the opportunity to provide expanded education, outreach, and training, as well as the negotiation of Voluntary Partnerships and alliances with businesses, local labor affiliates, associations, and other Federal Agencies. Responding to Catastrophes in our area of jurisdiction was also a duty. (See below)

Assistant Area Director (enforcement) March, 1989 to Jan, 2000. In this management enforcement position, I supervised 16 compliance officers, both safety and industrial hygienists. Part of my duties was to give and review assignments for inspections, investigation, complainants, and catastrophes .A vital part of this function was to prepare the compliance Officer and there reports for the Administration Law Review. One of the most important facets of these enforcement cases were the negotiations that accompanied the settlement of these cases. Supervisors are obligated to respond with there field officers to all large accidents, and disasters in the work place.

Regulatory Compliance Officer (enforcement) Sept. 1983 to March 1989 I held this enforcement position which required me to conduct program inspections, complaints, accidents, and catastrophe investigations. The documentation of my reports had to be appropriate for presentation before an Administration Law Judge. Performing training, outreach, and educating were also an intricate aspect of the Compliance Officers duties.

New York City Firefighter (fire duty) Oct, 1960 to Sept 1983 The years with the NYFD help prepare me to respond to all manner of emergencies, accidents and disasters. My first exposure to the Incident command center concept was initiated during these years. The training in confidence, self control, patience and clear thinking developed and matured with my tenure in the NYFD. As a member of a waterfront fire company I had first hand knowledge and experience in handling ship, huge warehouse, and giant industrial fires.

Significant Events in work History

As a CAS, and a member of the OSHA Emergency Response Team I was assigned to Ground Zero at the World Trade Center from 9-11-01 to 6-10-02. Attended Strategy meetings and operated the OSHA Command Center with several other CAS's, One of my aside functions was to inspect pier 90. The headquarters of the FEMA command Center. At that time I met and worked successfully with two different FEMA Site Safety and Health managers/ Officers.

As a CAS, I was successful in negotiating several partnerships for the Occupational Safety and Health Administration with Slattery Skanska, Tully Construction, and Honeywell International. These partnerships had many other signatories that are too numerous to cite.

As CAS, I was required to interface with the Emergency Management Departments of Suffolk and Nassau Counties. Would speak with all the Emergency responders, as to OSHA's role during catastrophes, disasters and acts of terrorism.

As a CAS, I was obligated to train Compliance Officers, other federal employees, and personnel in the private sector in safety and health standards, and concepts. Have taught the 10 Hr, and 30 Hr OSHA courses.

As a CAS, I was the OSHA representative to the U.S.Postal Service in Suffolk and Nassau Counties. I was successful in working with the Postal Ergonomic team, in a 1500 employee facility, in reducing the ergonomic injury rate.

As the Assistant Area director I headed the team that investigated the Mc Rory fire which resulted in several fatalities and became a significant case for OSHA.

As a compliance officer I was assigned the Du Pont Hotel and Casino Fire investigation in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, where 97 people died. I formed two teams of commonwealth investigators, and trained them. **Then led them on an inspection of the Hotel and Casino. This investigation was particularly grueling, in that most of the walk around inspection had to be done in tyvex suits, for fear of an asbestos exposure.** It was brought to a successful conclusion, and was also a significant case for OSHA. Consequently I was assigned a month later to conduct the questioning of all witnesses.

As a compliance officer I was assigned the Department of Agriculture disease control center inspection at the Plum Island facility, off Long Island New York. Conducted a month and a half inspection of there above and below ground facilities. The constant decontamination process and inspecting in negative pressure environments was an eye opening experience. **These working conditions help prepare me for the possible dangers of Ground Zero, or any future disaster I may encounter.**

As a firefighter I was assigned firefighting duties in Harlem and in the Bushwick areas of New York City during the riots in both locations. We responded with one engine truck and one ladder truck and two police cars, with

anti-sniper units in them. **This also added maturation in working efficiently in chaotic and dangerous work environments.**
