

Lieutenant General Paul E. Menoher, Jr.  
US Army (Retired)

Paul Menoher served over 35 years on active duty in the US Army, retiring on 28 February 1997, as the Army's Senior Intelligence Officer, the Deputy Chief of Staff for Intelligence (DCSINT). He assumed the position of DCSINT on 10 February 1995. Before that he served as Commanding General (CG) of the US Army Intelligence and Security Command (INSCOM); CG of the US Army Intelligence Center and Fort Huachuca, AZ; CG of the US Army Intelligence Agency; and Director of the Army Intelligence Master Plan.

Before becoming a General Officer, he commanded the 501<sup>st</sup> Military Intelligence Brigade in Korea; served as the G2 of VII Corps in Germany; and Chief of Collection for US Army Europe. He also commanded two battalions and served in Vietnam and Cambodia.

Subsequent to retiring from the Army, Paul worked in industry as a Business Development executive for four years during which time his company was bought by larger firms four times which prompted him to go out on his own as an independent consultant. He is now basically retired but still responds to calls for help from companies with new technology he believes will provide significant value added to the Armed Forces.

Paul was commissioned through ROTC at the University of California, Berkeley from which he received a BA Degree in International Relations. He has a Masters Degree in the same field from George Washington University. His military education includes the Infantry Officer Basic Course, Defense Intelligence College, the Naval Command and Staff College, and the US Army War College.

His awards include two awards of the Distinguished Service Medal; three awards of the Legion of Merit; two awards of the Bronze Star; four awards of the Meritorious Service Medal; the Joint Service and Army Commendation Medals, and the Expert Infantryman's Badge. He has been inducted into the Military Intelligence Hall of Fame; awarded an Honorary Doctorate from the Joint Military Intelligence College; given the Director of Central Intelligence's National Intelligence Distinguished Service Medal; and presented the Association of Old Crows (an International organization promoting all phases of electronic warfare) "Gold" Award for lifetime accomplishments. On 19 October 2011, he was presented another Lifetime Achievement Award by the US Geospatial Intelligence Foundation (a proponent for the development and integration of Geospatial Intelligence) for his visionary and innovative employment of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles and his determined efforts to provide commanders at all levels a digital, high fidelity, three dimensional presentation of their individual battlefields. To accomplish this

he drove the US Intelligence Community to collect and produce high fidelity digital terrain and elevation data decades ahead of their original schedules.

LTG Menoher is married to the former Bebe Etzler of Dallas, TX. His son, Scott, is a civilian employee of the US Joint Special Operations Command (JSOC) and just completed his 11th tour in Iraq. Scott has also served one tour in Afghanistan.
